

In Rescue a Year and Still Looking for Love!

With a sunny disposition that would make Shirley Temple look like a rain cloud, Clipper is the happiest little soul around! He came into rescue one year ago this month and is still looking for a forever family. Look at that sweet face...isn't he cute?!

The trouble for Clipper is that he is a diabetic. Many people are uneasy with his condition thinking it is very complicated to handle. But it's not. He has to have two shots of insulin a day. They are simple to administer...just under a pinch of loose skin...no veins to worry about. He only requires a little extra love and care, and he fills every day with joie de'veive!

Diabetes in pets is a very manageable condition. It is not a reason to euthanize. Most diabetics like Clipper require a prescription diet and insulin shots which must be given at regular 12-hour intervals. Clipper always gets a small piece of string cheese before and after his shot. After he eats, he knows when enough time has passed and will come looking to get his shot and cheese. He's very good about his shots too. No fussing!

Also Clipper has cataracts and is virtually blind. But once he knows his environment, he can steer around corners like he has radar! He loves to play and will drag a favorite blanket all over the room or push a bed around like he's moving furniture. That's his "busy" time. He loves to give kisses too.




BB sets his sights on your heart!

Keep Your Maltese Cool & Prevent Heatstroke!

Heatstroke can be the serious and often fatal result of a dog's prolonged exposure to excessive heat. Below are the signs of heatstroke and the actions you should take if your dog is overcome.

Early Stages:

- Heavy panting.
- Rapid breathing.
- Excessive drooling.
- Bright red gums and tongue.
- Standing 4-square, posting or spreading out in an attempt to maintain balance.

Advanced Stages:

- White or blue gums.
- Lethargy, unwillingness to move.
- Uncontrollable urination or defecation.
- Labored, noisy breathing.
- Shock.

If your dog begins to exhibit signs of heatstroke, you should immediately try to cool the dog down:

- Apply rubbing alcohol to the dog's paw pads.
- Apply ice packs to the groin area.
- Hose down with water.
- Allow the dog to lick ice chips or drink a small amount of water.
- Offer Pedialyte to restore electrolytes.

Go Bananas Training Treats

- 🐾 3 cups oatmeal
- 🐾 1 1/4 cups flour
- 🐾 2 eggs
- 🐾 1/4 cup oil
- 🐾 1/2 cup honey
- 🐾 1/2 cup milk
- 🐾 2 mashed bananas

Blend liquid ingredients, eggs and mashed bananas, making sure to mix well. Add flour and oatmeal. Mixture will be similar to cake mix. Spread into a well-greased pizza pan and bake at 325 degrees for about 25 minutes. Cut into tiny squares or strips using a pizza cutter. Keep refrigerated; store unused in freezer. The furballs give these two paws up!!! 🐾
